INTRODUCTION

WELCOME TO OUR FIRST MAGAZINE

Hospital Radio Harefield is a group of fifteen volunteers who broadcast exclusively to the patients in Harefield Hospital. Each weekday evening you can listen to us from 7pm, from 10am on Saturdays and from midday on Sundays. A full broadcasting timetable appears later in the magazine. You can hear us on your own headset, just plug in and select channel two on your control, either the hand held ones or on some wards, the control box by your bed. You can also alter the volume from these.

If you have not got a headset or the radio is not working, please ask one of the nurses to let us know. When we are not broadcasting we hand over to BBC Radio 2 on channel two and you also have the choice of Radio 3, Radio 4 and LBC.

Our telephone lines are open whenever we are broadcasting. You can ring us anytime for a request, dedication or just a chat. Harefield 3737 is the number to dial and we are on extension 461. We have quite a large and varied record library, so whatever your taste in music we can usually find something you like.

Whilst we are broadcasting we relay the Independent Radio News bulletins each hour to keep you informed on what is going on in the world.

History and Future

An internal radio service was first started in 1965, by the Hospital Administrator, a registrar and the entertainments officer. Broadcasts were first made from a draughty corner of the Concert Hall stage, using one microphone on a table, round which the presenters sat. As more people became involved, a Committee was formed and Radio 290 was born. Broadcasting from the old projection booth above the Concert Hall (where we still are). Some years later the management applied for registration with the Charities Commission. This they could not do with the name Radio 290, so they changed the name - were accepted as a registered charity and thus became, Hospital Radio Harefield.

In 1977 things were in a bad way, The equipment was failing, members had lost interest and hardly any programmes were being broadcast . . . then along came someone called Ian Jones who took over, put out appeals for new members and started building the station up again. A whole new team of people turned up, among them a professional broadcaster and an engineer who really knew what he was doing, someone we needed very badly, as for years we had struggled along with "bodgers".

All was going well till August 1978 when our old dilapidated equipment finally gave up - never to work again. So it was all out fund raising to buy some new equipment. The Hospital League of Friends helped us out with a permanent loan of £600 and a repayable loan of £200. Six months (and a great deal of hard work later) everything was ready and on the 17th of February 1979, our present studio was opened officially by Kenneth Connor from the comedians "Carry On" team.



Ian Jones, who was then Chairman decided that he was going to do a sponsored marathon broadcast for 60 hours non-stop to help raise more funds. He started at 9am on December 1st and (just about) finished at 9pm on December 3rd, having been in the studio without any breaks at all for 60 hours.

This was an achievement that was to earn us a place in the 'Guinness Book of Records' for the longest non-stop broadcast on Hospital Radio.

On the second day of the marathon, a television film crew from Thames at Six turned up to film the marathon for broadcast the following day.

Since that time, we have just celebrated two years of successful broadcasting from our present studio. We now find that we have outgrown our present studio, and need more space to be able to improve the services we provide. In May last year, after negotiations with the Hospital Administration, we were given the old bowls pavilion in the grounds of the hospital. The building is at present in a state of dilapidation as it has not been used for some years. However, because of its size and facilities, it is ideal for our purposes. Plans for the necessary internal building work were drawn up and have been passed by the Area Health Authority. All we need now is the money to enable us to carry out the building work and to equip the new studios.

When all is finished, we shall have two fully equipped studios a master control room and record and tape library, a large lounge, a kitchen, an office and toilet facilities.

Meanwhile a fund raising programme is in full swing. This was started off on Sunday the 22nd of March with a 15 mile sponsored walk by our own members.

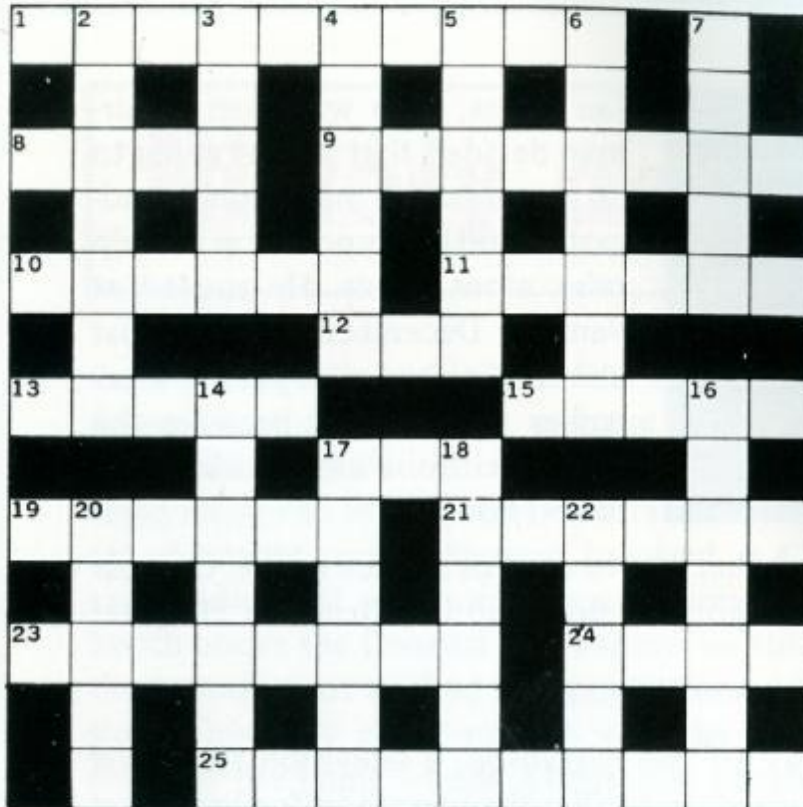

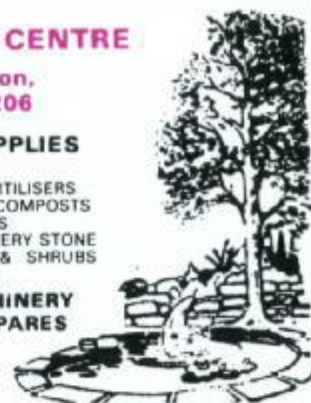

Hospital Radio Programming

The key is the good will and the voluntary services of the people who have a genuine wish to contribute to our efforts to produce a reliable and good service, for you the listener. We try to create a balance of information, music, interest, and entertainment. It is



my job not only as a broadcaster but as the "Assistant Programme Controller", to see that the programmes run smoothly and without a hitch. It encompasses every aspect of broadcasting, this can only be achieved by close liaison with the "Controller of Programmes"

who has the final say on what type of programme will be best suited to the proposed time slot. The word slot is used because programmes are slotted into a format, let me illustrate this point further. Take the 10 - 11pm slot, one would not put a pop music show here simply because people at that time are settling down for a nights rest. An easy tempo then, for the programme is the right solution for this slot.

Contrast plays a great part in Hospital Radio, it really is our duty to bring the world to you the listener. We hope that we have succeeded in having a good broadcasting style. A good example is The Saturday Sports Special which is presented by Dave West from 2 - 5p.m. The title would suggest nothing but a sports content, we are very aware that other people listen at this time so we have made this slot a mixture of up to the minute sports information, plus a variety of music, interviews, a classical spot, and sports results. During the spring and summer we have an outside broadcast from the League of Friends Pavilion, this coincides with the Saturday Sports Special from 2.30 - 4.00p.m. Friends and relatives can come and give a message, be interviewed, or have a dedication played on air for them.

This then is the essence of programming, variety and contrast. Take the case of The History of Ruislip, it took just under six months from the time it was thought of till the day it was broadcast. I co-produced with Tony Vigor (Programme Controller) he did the research and scripted the various segments that were to be recorded. It was my job to make, produce and to record the sound effects to be used. Having done this Tony narrated the unfolding story, the effects were mixed in and I also edited the subsequent tape, down to programme length which was four 1½ hour episodes.

Programmes of good quality and content is the thing we strive for, everyone on the station contributes something to either programmes fund raising or ward rounds etc. We always welcome new people with ideas. There are too many facets of programming, that unfortunately I haven't the space here to describe to you, so I will just sum up by saying that Hospital Radio is for you, the patient, if you like "A Friend That's Just An Arms Length Away"

Harefield's annual Carnival will be held on Saturday 30th May in the grounds of the hospital. The Carnival is organised by three groups:—

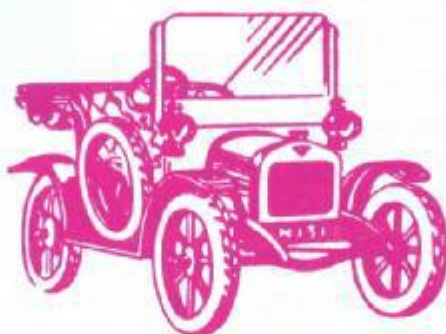
- The Hospital League of Friends

HONEYDEW GRAPE COCKTAIL

- 3 baby honeydew melons
- 4 tbsp. redcurrant jelly
- 3 tbsp. sherry, juice 1 lemon
- black grapes, lemon slices
- small sprigs mint.

Cut the melons in half through the centre, not lengthways and carefully hollow out pips from each melon cup and stand upright in sundae glasses. Dissolve redcurrant jelly, sherry and the lemon juice over a low heat. Allow to cool. Then break grapes off stems — enough to fill centre of each melon cup. Mix with sherry sauce and then spoon into melon cups. Chill for 1 hour. Garnish with twisted lemon slices and sprigs of mint.

HAM & PINEAPPLE PATE

- ½lb lean ham
- 6oz butter
- 8oz can crushed pineapple
- seasoning
- pinch grated nutmeg
- 1 tbsp. brandy
- 2 tbsp. chopped gherkin
- melted butter
- cayenne pepper
- black olives

Finely chop or mince the ham. Soften the butter and mix with the ham, drained pineapple, seasoning, nutmeg, parsley, brandy & gherkins. Spoon into cocotte or ramekin dishes and then smooth the surface of the pate. Top with a thin layer of melted butter and chill until set. Decorate each individual pate with a sprinkling of the cayenne and an olive. Serve with fingers of toast.

AVOCADO CRAB GRATIN

- 3 avocados
- juice ½ lemon
- 1 small onion, finely chopped
- 6-8oz crabmeat
- 3 tbsp soured cream
- 4oz gruyere cheese, grated
- parsley

Cut avocados in half, removing stones. Brush cut surfaces with lemon juice. Mix lemon juice with onion, seasoning, crab, soured cream and half the cheese. Spoon onto avocado halves and sprinkle with remaining cheese. Place into a lightly greased ovenproof dish and bake at Mk. 5, 375 deg. for 20-25 minutes. Garnish the hot avocado with parsley. Serve with fingers of brown bread and butter.

CURRIED SALMON PATE

- 7½oz can of salmon
- 4oz butter
- 4oz cream cheese
- grated rind & juice ½ lemon
- salt & ground black pepper
- 3 teasp. curry powder
- 2oz peeled prawns
- finely chopped parsley.

Drain excess oil from salmon and flake finely with a fork. Beat butter with cream cheese, the lemon rind and juice, seasoning and curry the salmon must be beaten until it is thoroughly & completely mixed and smooth. Add most of the prawns, finely chopped - reserve a few for the garnish. Spoon pate into one large dish, or individual dishes. Smooth surface and sprinkle it with parsley. Garnish with prawns and chill. To be served with brown bread and butter.
